

Mentoring Overview

- Volunteer role flexible, informal and part-time
- An effective communicator
- An empathetic listener
- No prior training required

"Mentoring is a way of helping another understand more fully and learn more comprehensively from their day-to-day experience." (Hamilton, 1993)



Benefits of Mentoring

Helps students to develop academic, personal, professional & interpersonal skills

Supports students to adapt to University life quickly and consolidate learning and experiences

Takes the load of staff to provide guidance, skills development, signposting and navigation to students

Improves student/staff feedback and strengthens links to Student Voice

Help remove barriers to participation for students from all backgrounds

Mental health/wellbeing support for students

Improves attainment and degree outcomes

Develops a sense of belonging and inclusion in the university community

Supporting students from a range of cultural backgrounds to create a sense of community and belonging.

Connected to a widening participation plan commitment to target this specific group of students.

- Mentors working with mentees to:
- Increase self-belief and confidence
- Enhance learning
- Celebrate success and support collaboration
- Provide empathy, listening, guidance and shared experiences.
- Support students to achieve and build on their attainment (degree outcomes) and empower for success
- Connects to the notion of 'developmental relationship'
